



The Uncanny Catalog: How Do We “Care” Now?

While research associated with an undefined “ethicalness” existed, at the first Ethics in Knowledge Organization conference in 2009, the field committed to articulating and formalizing this research stream that reflected the gradual shift in focus, from system to user, from singular to pluralistic epistemologies, from knowing to caring. As the constellation formed by “ethicalness” began to take shape, researchers recognized not only practical issues with organizing and findability but also the political and conceptual violence that can occur not only for users of a catalog but also for contributors to the catalog. While many ethical problems and approaches were defined, how far have we come in 14 years? What has stymied us, and what new ethical challenges await?

Short Bio

Dr. Melodie Fox is the Assistant Vice President of Curriculum and Knowledge Management at the Milwaukee School of Engineering, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, USA and teaches information organization to students at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and Simmons University. She holds an MLIS and a Ph.D. in Information Studies, focusing in knowledge organization and gender studies, from the ischool at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Her research interests include gender classification, epistemology, ethics in subject analysis, and the social consequences of the organization of information.

Ethics of Information and the Metaverse

In his keynote talk, David Haynes provides an overview of some of the ethical issues that arise from the use of the metaverse. The growth in the user-base and the expansion of features on the metaverse platforms will throw up new concerns and issues. A regulatory approach is needed to move beyond the protections afforded to social media users today.

Short Bio

DAVID HAYNES is an enthusiastic information scientist who teaches knowledge organization and information governance in the Applied Informatics group at Edinburgh Napier University. He is particularly interested in the privacy and security issues associated with social media, the metaverse and the role that metadata plays in information governance. David is actively involved with ISKO and serves as Secretary to the ISKO Board of Directors. He also chairs the ISKO Working Group on Metadata Guidelines for Subject Access. He is on the editorial advisory boards of the Aslib Journal of Information Management and Revista Em Questão (Brazil) and regularly reviews papers for a variety of LIS journals. He is currently co-editor of a special issue of Knowledge Organization on Education and Training for Knowledge Organization, due for publication in 2023. He gained a PhD in Information Science from City, University of London after a 30-year career as an information management consultant and project manager.
